## **Instructions for Authors**

A paper should be submitted as an MSWord file attachment by email to the editor DST@europia.fr. All papers received are subject to review. All reviewed and accepted papers have to be resubmitted, implementing reviewers and editors comments and suggestions. Only accepted papers will be considered for publication in the International Journal of Design Sciences and Technology.

The paper will be written in English. It will be double-spaced with 30 mm margins on all sides (A4 size). All Figures and Tables with their respective captions should be numbered consecutively and be placed, each on a separate page, at the end of the paper. The use of Bold, Italics, ALL CAPS, SMALL CAPS, etc. are discouraged.

The first page of the paper must contain the full title of the paper as well as the name, affiliation, address, telephone, fax and email of authors. Also mention the name, address, telephone, fax and email of the author to whom all correspondence to be directed.

The second page should contain the full title of the paper, the sub-title (if any), an abstract of 150 to 250 words summarising the content of the paper and 5 keywords for the purpose of indexing. Maximum length of a long paper is 6000 words (3000 words for a short paper). Chapters of a paper should be numbered consecutively (headings and sub-headings). The use of Footnotes and endnotes are discouraged.

All Figures should be referred to in the text as Figure 1, Figure 2, etc. Line drawings should be of good quality. Use light background if possible. Photographs and screen shots should also be submitted as JPEG files (use high resolution for better results). Authors should prepare high quality figures. Avoid the use of colours in your illustrations, as the journal is not published in colour. Maximum width and height of a figure are respectively 120 mm and 180 mm.

Formula's should be numbered consecutively and should be mentioned in the text.

Use Harvard system of reference. References are collected at the end of the paper, arranged in alphabetical order by the first author's surname, followed by initials. Separate two authors by an & sign. When more than two authors, add et al after the first author's name and initials. Dates will appear between brackets after the authors' name(s). This is followed by the title of the book, name of the publisher, place of publication and page number(s). See examples below for referring to a paper in a book or a journal.
